Twentieth-century Mexican artist Frida Kahlo continues to fascinate us with her arresting gaze, signature fashion, and trailblazing legacy. A docent will guide us through an exhibition showcasing many of the artist’s most important paintings and drawings. More than 60 works, many rarely seen outside of Mexico, include self-portraits, still lifes, and compositions from her imagination. Also on view are photographs of the artist taken by those closest to her, including internationally renowned photographers Lola Álvarez Bravo, Imogen Cunningham, Julien Levy, Dora Maar, and Nickolas Muray. This exhibition closely examines the inimitable style and complexity of Kahlo’s paintings.
